## 2018 WYOMING LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

### **WEEK THREE**

There is only one more week of the Wyoming Legislative Budget Session. Following is a list of the bills that Wyoming REALTORS are watching. ### HB0013 Municipal extraterritorial jurisdiction-repeal.

Sponsored by: Joint Corporations, Elections & Political Subdivisions Interim Committee

AN ACT relating to municipalities; repealing and removing certain extraterritorial jurisdiction asserted by municipalities; modifying notice requirements to landowners outside municipal boundaries; making conforming amendments; and providing for an effective date.

# **REALTOR® POSITION:** Support

**STATUS:** Introduced 56-2-2, referred to the Corporations Committee. Recommended Do Pass, passed Committee of the Whole with an amendment and passed 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on 2/23/18. Passed third and final reading in the House, 47-11. Referred to the Senate Corporations Committee, recommended do pass, 4-1. Placed on General File in the Senate.

NOTE: This bill completely eliminated the extraterritorial jurisdiction for municipalities. Needless to say, it was strongly opposed by the municipalities. After the debate in the House, the Cities and Counties lobbyists were directed to get together and find a compromise. The Corporations committee voted it out as a place holder in the Senate. If HB 0014 as amended moves forward, this bill will be held back and will die.

#### HB0014 Municipal jurisdiction.

Sponsored by: Joint Corporations, Elections & Political Subdivisions Interim Committee

AN ACT relating to municipalities; restricting extraterritorial jurisdiction asserted by a municipality; specifying procedures for a municipality to exercise extraterritorial jurisdiction; specifying applicability; making conforming amendments; and providing for an effective date.

#### **REALTOR® POSITION: Support**

**STATUS:** Introduced 56-3-1, referred to the Corporations Committee. Recommended Do Pass, passed Committee of the Whole amended, passed 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on 2/23/18. Passed third and final reading in the House, 50-8-2. Hugely amended in the Senate Corporations committee to become the compromise bill between the Cities and Counties. Passed the committee and will be on general file in the Senate.

#### HB0135 Housing authorities.

Sponsored by: Schwartz

AN ACT relating to municipalities and counties; amending powers which may be exercised by a housing authority; authorizing the appointment of additional commissioners to a regional housing authority as specified; authorizing staggered terms for regional housing authority commissioners; and providing for an effective date.

**REALTOR® POSITION: Support** 

**STATUS:** Introduced 49-11, referred to the Corporations Committee. Recommended do pass. Passed 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, failed 3<sup>rd</sup> and final reading in the House 25-32-2. There were concerns raised that it would allow Housing Authorities to enact extraction fees as are used in Teton County. Unfortunately the sponsor was not able to overcome this argument and literally talked his bill to death.

## **SF0006** Real estate exemption restoration.

Sponsored by: Joint Labor, Health & Social Services Interim Committee

AN ACT relating to worker's compensation and unemployment insurance; exempting real estate professionals from coverage as specified; and providing for an effective date.

## **REALTOR® POSITION:** Support

**STATUS:** Introduced 29-0-1, referred to the Labor Committee, recommended DO PASS, Passed General File and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, 3<sup>rd</sup> and final reading in the Senate will be on Monday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. Passed the Senate 30-0, referred to the House Corporations Committee, recommended Do Pass. Passed Committee of the Whole and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading in the House. Will be heard for the 3<sup>rd</sup> and final time in the House on Monday, March 5<sup>th</sup>. (Is on the consent list, which is a very good sign.)

### SF0042 Professional licensing-applicant criminal records.

Sponsored by: Joint Labor, Health & Social Services Interim Committee

AN ACT relating to professions and occupations; clarifying requirements for licensing, certification and registration related to a person's background and criminal record; requiring any disqualifying offense to relate to the profession or occupation or the ability to practice the profession or occupation; providing considerations for licensing boards regarding applicable convictions; requiring professional licensing boards to review their rules for consistency with this act; and providing for an effective date.

#### **REALTOR® POSITION:** Support with amendments

**STATUS:** Introduced 28-1-1, referred to the Labor Committee, recommended DO PASS amended, Passed General File. Passed the Senate 27-2-1. Referred to the House Labor Committee, recommended Do Pass. Passed Committee of the Whole and is set for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on March 5<sup>th</sup>.

## SF0089 Local government distributions.

Sponsored by: Joint Appropriations Committee

AN ACT relating to local government funding; providing funding to cities and towns; providing funding to counties; providing local government funding formulas and distributions; providing legislative intent; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

#### **REALTOR® POSITION:** Monitor

**STATUS:** Introduced 29-1, referred to the Appropriations Committee. Recommended DO PASS, passed General File and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, 3<sup>rd</sup> and final reading in the Senate will be Monday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. Passed the Senate 30-0. Referred to the House Appropriations Committee. Recommended Do Pass, placed on General File in the House.

#### SF0113 Community development districts.

Sponsored by: Nethercott

AN ACT relating to cities and towns; authorizing municipalities to create community development districts as specified; specifying requirements; providing definitions; specifying duties and powers of community development districts and district boards of directors; authorizing assessments; specifying duties of municipalities; amending definitions; and providing for an effective date.

# **REALTOR® POSITION: Support**

**STATUS:** Introduced 28-1-1, referred to the Corporations Committee. Recommended a Do Pass with amendments. Passed Committee of the Whole and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading in the Senate, passed 3<sup>rd</sup> and final reading in the Senate, 23-7. Referred to the House Corporations Committee, recommended Do Pass. Placed on General File in the House. Will be heard in Committee of the Whole on March 5<sup>th</sup>.

# School capital construction-constitutional amendment.

Sponsored by: Scott

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing to amend the Wyoming Constitution to transfer responsibility to construct school facilities to school districts; to provide for specified mandatory and optional state funding mechanisms; and to provide a ballot statement.

#### **REALTOR® POSITION: Monitor**

**STATUS:** Introduced 30-0, referred to the Revenue Committee. Recommended Do Pass. Passed Committee of the Whole in the Senate. Passed 2<sup>nd</sup> reading and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading in the Senate in an amended form 21-7-2. Referred to the Education Committee in the House. Scheduled for a hearing on March 2<sup>nd</sup> if time permits.
